

# Locale Classification

## Introduction

The Locale classification is a segmentation of small areas within a set of urban-rural groupings.

Within each urban-rural grouping, postcodes and census output areas are classified into more detailed segments based on 3 separate dimensions:

- population density
- town size
- affluence.

## Locale Groups

The 7 Locale Groups at the core of the classification are:

- **Large City**
- **Medium city or large town**
- **Small city or medium town**
- **Accessible Small town (within 10 miles or so of a large settlement)**
- **Remote Small town (more than 10 miles or so of a large settlement)**
- **Accessible Rural area (within 10 miles or so of a large settlement)**
- **Remote Rural area (more than 10 miles or so of a large settlement)**

More detailed descriptions of the Locale Groups and Types are shown on the following pages.

# Locale Classification

## Locale Groups

### A Large City

Group A is made up of all cities that have populations greater than 500,000 - London, Birmingham, Glasgow and Manchester.

### B Medium City or Large Town

Group B includes medium cities or large towns that have populations between 100,000 and 500,000, such as Reading, Bolton, York, Edinburgh or Wolverhampton.

### C Small City or medium Town

Group C comprises cities and towns that have populations between 15,000 and 100,000, such as Wells, Rochdale, Worthing or Antrim in Northern Ireland.

### D Accessible Small Town

Group D includes small towns with populations between 2,000 and 15,000 and within 10 miles or so of one of the large urban areas defined in Locale Groups A, B and C. Examples of towns in this LOCALE Group are Cobham, Selsey or Bodmin.

### E Remote Small Town

Group E is made up of small towns that have populations between 2,000 and 15,000 and are more than 10 miles or so from the large urban areas defined in Locale Groups A, B and C. This group includes towns such as Southwold in Suffolk, Whitby in North Yorkshire and Minehead in Somerset. Towns in this Locale Group are mainly isolated urban centres for remote rural areas.

### F Accessible Rural Area

Group F covers villages with populations between 500 and 2,000 and areas that have populations of less than 500 (hamlets, open countryside and town fringes) and are within 10 miles or so of a larger urban area defined in Locale Groups A, B and C.

### G Remote Rural Area

Group G includes villages that have population between 500 and 2,000 and areas that have population less than 500 (hamlets and open countryside) and are more than 10 miles or so from a large urban area defined in Locale Groups A, B and C.

For Locale Groups A-D, each city or town lying within a larger conurbation is treated as a separate entity within its own boundary. Locale also includes flags which enable the larger conurbations to be identified – e.g. West Midlands or Greater Manchester.
